1 WEEK 05-09 FEB	NATO RESILIENCE THROUGH CIVIL PREPAREDNESS (NRTCP 01/24)	The course aims to provide senior civilian and military experts with an understanding of the various aspects of resilience within respective areas of responsibility. It teaches the relationship between civil preparedness and improved operational effectiveness, thereby creating awareness and appreciation of the strategic layer of resilience on Operational Level. <p>1 WEEK 07-11 OCT</p>	<p>CIMIC INTERCULTURAL ADVANCED LIAISON COURSE (CIAL 01/24)</p>	<p>Course is aimed to: fully engage students into the complexity of the current and more relevant geo-strategic scenarios; enhance CIMIC personnel skills & capabilities to comprehend the new challenges of modern Theatres of Operations from hybrid threats to mass migrations, from Climate change to Trans-national criminal activities; Provide students the knowledge and competences to fulfil their role of main facilitators for the establishment of an effective liaison between military actors and the ample complex and intercultural domain of non-military actors.</p>	<p>Nominees should be military (OR5 and above) or equivalent civilian personnel who are or will be appointed to a CIMIC assignment from tactical to strategic level. The course is also open to civilians with a vested interest in civil military interaction and intercultural communication; Candidates to CIAL must have attended and successfully completed the CIMIC Liaison Course in advance.</p>
